
RMIT Training is owned by RMIT University. We specialise in English Language Pathway and Foundation Studies programs for international students, designed to give you the skills you need to succeed at university.

If you are an international student under 18 years old, you must have welfare arrangements in place to apply for your student visa. This is to ensure that you are living in a secure environment with adequate practical and emotional support to keep you safe before you turn 18.

Transport

Travelling around Melbourne is easy and convenient. Whether you're arriving for the first time, returning home to visit family and friends or living here, you'll find there are plenty of options for you to get around.

- Bike riding make use of Melbourne's many bike paths and RMIT's bicycle storage facilities
- Public transport Melbourne's public transport service includes connected trams, trains and buses, all accessible via a Myki card
- Eligible students can apply for the International Undergraduate Student Education Pass (iUSEpass) which is a discounted annual pass for use on public transport in Victoria
- Ride share and scooters established rideshare services such as Uber are easily available in Melbourne, as well as e-scooters for hire in the inner city.

- Each level delivered over 10 weeks (2 x 5 week modules)

English for Academic Purposes (EAP) is an accredited course delivered by RMIT English Worldwide (REW) CRICOS Course code: 076733A.

*All programs listed from pages 6-8 of this guide are available to student visa holders as their principal course or may be packaged with an RMIT University award course. Our English programs are also available to other visa holders provided the length of enrolment at RMIT does not exceed the conditions of their visa

Entry requirements:

To apply for the English for Academic Purposes course you must complete one of the following:

- RMIT English Worldwide placement test
- IELTS English test
- TOEFL iBT English test
- PTE English test

Your English language test results will indicate which academic level you will be eligible to enter.

Academic levels overview: Elementary - Advanced Plus

Elementary

Learn English to communicate in everyday situations.

Practise listening, speaking, reading and writing about the weather, activities, feelings, routines, giving directions and instructions, likes and dislikes.

Upper-intermediate

Develop and enhance your academic English skills.

You will learn grammar and vocabulary that will help you to understand complex texts. You will practise listening to lectures and writing academic essays and you will also participate in regular group discussions (tutorials) which will develop your speaking and listening skills.

Pre-intermediate

Learn how to communicate in English about the present, past and future.

Describe objects, places and people. You will learn to make arrangements, suggestions and how to give instructions. You will read different styles of text and practise listening and speaking.

Advanced

Develop academic skills to prepare for university.

In this course, you will develop academic skills to prepare for university. You will practise formal, academic writing and learn about academic referencing. You will take part in group discussions and work toward giving a formal, researched presentation on a topic of your choice. Intermediate

Learn grammar and vocabulary to use in study and in everyday life.

You will write structured paragraphs and essays and describe graphs, practise reading and listening to news and other texts. You will express your opinions on a range of topics, supporting your ideas with reasons.

Advanced plus

Develop academic and research skills to prepare you for university in Australia.

You will conduct secondary research and present your findings in a written report and in an oral presentation. You will develop reading and listening skills to help you understand academic articles and lectures.

RMIT English Study Abroad and Study Tour Programs for University Groups and Professional Organisations

Who can take an English Study Abroad or Study tour program?

Universities can choose to send 1-50 + students to participate in integrated classes with other students from all around the world and/or closed programs that can be designed to match your needs and feature industry visits or cultural excursions.

Course length and prerequisites

Options vary from 4 weeks (minimum) up to 45 weeks. Applicants should be over 18 years old and require a student visa for programs over 10 weeks.

A minimum of 10 participants are required for closed programs.

Study tour services

Group program packages include a high level of services for students including:

- Airport transfers (pick-up and return)
- Excursions and activities (optional)
- Accommodation (homestay)

Programs

Foundation Studies

Foundation Studies is chosen by international students all over the world as their pathway to higher education. Foundation Studies is delivered by RMIT Training, and provides you with the knowledge, skills and confidence you need for your future academic success. It also gives you the opportunity to study subjects that align with your interests and study goals.

Choose from streams in:

- Art, Design and Architecture
- Business
- Communication and Social Context
- Engineering and Science
- Health
- Information Technology (IT)

English language requirements:

To study this program you will need to complete one of the following English proficiency tests:

- IELTS (Academic): minimum overall band of 5.5 (with no individual band below 5.0)
- TOEFL (Internet Based Test IBT): minimum overall score of 50 (with minimum of 5 in Reading, 5 in Listening, 14 in Speaking and 15 in Writing)
- Pearson PTE (Academic): minimum score of 42 (with no communication band less than 36)
- C1 Advanced: minimum of 162 with no less than 154 in any component
- Completion of RMIT EAP Upper-Intermediate (or higher).

Entry requirements:

You must have successfully completed a senior secondary school qualification comparable to an Australian Year 11 with a minimum D average.

To determine your equivalent high school qualification to an Australian Year 11, please check relevant country requirements at RMIT Country Equivalency.

Age requirement:

Students must be 16 years of age upon commencement of this program.

Please note, meeting the minimum academic requirements does not guarantee entry. Your application will still need to be assessed and accepted.


Overseas Student Health Cover

Before you Arrive

It's never too early to start planning your move to Melbourne! Here is some information to help get you started with your plans to study abroad.

Before you leave

Apply for your visa:

All international students must have a visa to study in Australia. Visa arrangements may take anywhere from a few weeks to six months to finalise, depending on the assessment level of your country and other requirements. For the most updated and accurate advice please refer to information set out by the Australian Department of Home Affairs.

Plan your travel:

Once you've received your student visa, you can start organising your flights! When booking flights, make sure you arrive with plenty of time to attend any registration, welcome and important orientation sessions prior to you program start date.

Organise your accommodation:

There are many accommodation options for international students in Melbourne. RMIT provides free services and resources to help you find somewhere to live that will suit your budget and preferences, with tailored support for Under 18s.

Arriving in Melbourne


RMIT's free airport pick-up service is available to commencing international students who are:

- Under the age of 18, or
- An Australia Award Scholarship (AAS) recipient

Newly arriving international students who are not eligible for a free transfer can access a Cabcharge Digital Pass valued at \$100 for your transport from the airport to your accommodation.

Parents and Guardians

RMIT University is one of the top universities in Melbourne, and one of Australia's oldest tertiary institutions. Our state-of-the-art facilities, industry-based learning opportunities and international reputation with employers are just a few of the reasons why over 97,000 students, including 40,000 international students from over 190 countries and territories, choose to study with us.

Is your child under 18?

If your child will be under the age of 18 when they arrive in Australia, you must have their accommodation and welfare arrangements organised and approved either by the Department of Home Affairs or RMIT before they leave home.

This is to ensure they have appropriate day-to-day support to keep them safe and well.

Establishment costs

Before moving to Melbourne, we recommend putting aside \$AU3,000 – \$5,000 to cover set-up costs, such as a rental deposit, one month's rent in advance, as well as furniture and household items for those arranging their own accommodation.

Many student apartments come fully furnished, but most private rental homes do not. Ongoing costs will depend on your location, budget and lifestyle.

Our #1 priority is ensuring your child is safe, healthy and happy during their studies in Melbourne.

RMIT Training and **RMIT** University offer a number of resources to make this possible for all our students.

Language support

RMIT offers free English classes and full English courses for students wanting to improve their language skills. If your child feels they need extra help with English language or writing, we've partnered with Studiosity to provide personal support.

They can chat one-on-one with subject specialists on the platform anytime, 24/7, or submit their work for feedback.

Academic Support

Academic Support is a free service for all Foundation Studies and RMIT English Worldwide students. We help your child understand and correct any language problems, build skills and achieve success in their studies.

Students can bring academic problems or questions for tailored one-to-one help. Academic Support services are available face-to- face as well as online.

Peer-to-peer support

RMIT Training Student Ambassadors are current, or recently graduated students, who volunteer with the Student Experience team to connect with students, assist with event coordination, and share their experiences as an international student at RMIT Training.

RMIT University also has a number of initiatives in place to ensure your child has a positive study experience in Melbourne, including Kirrip (a club designed specifically to help students make social connections), other clubs and mentor programs.

24/7 campus security and patrol
