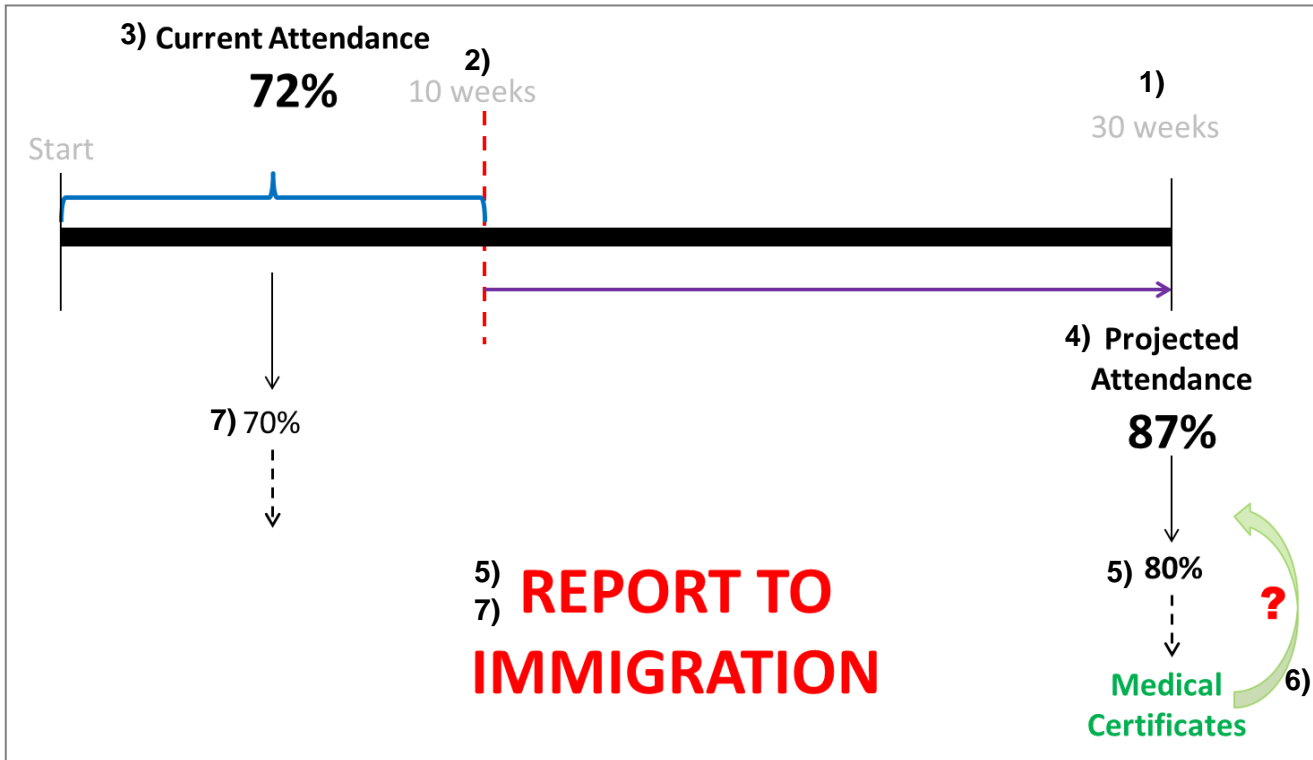


# Attendance, Immigration and Your Student Visa



1. This student has a 30-week course.
2. They are currently in week 10 of their course.
3. They have attended 72% of their classes in the 10 weeks (current attendance).
4. If they come every day from now until the end of their course they will finish with 87% (projected attendance).
5. If the Projected Attendance drops below 80%, RMIT English Worldwide (REW) starts the process to report to the Department of Home Affairs.

If the student has not provided any medical certificates, REW is required to report the student to the Department of Home Affairs for unsatisfactory attendance.

6. If the student has been absent because they were sick and they have seen a doctor and given medical certificates to Student Services to explain their absence, REW will consider the student's situation and will decide if it is necessary to report the student to the Department of Home Affairs or not. However, the student's current attendance must also be above 70%.

**Medical certificates do not cancel absences – your attendance percentage will still decrease.**

7. If the student's projected attendance is below 80%, and their current attendance is below 70%, REW is required to report the student to the Department of Home Affairs for unsatisfactory attendance, even if they have medical certificates, and the student's Electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCOE) will be cancelled.

**This may affect their student visa.**

**Note: lateness is included in your attendance calculation.**
